

WHO'S NUMBER 1?



Among banners on the outfield fences, there's another sign that may need some explanation. It's the representation of the retired jer-

sey #1, which was worn by John Castleberry, who first arrived in Orleans in 1983 as an assistant coach and then became the CCBL's youngest field manager the following year. During John's tenure as skipper of the Cardinals,


fans came to expect that the team would make the playoffs; his 1986 squad won the CCBL championship and he was named Manager of the Year. John took a squad of Cape Leaguers to the 1988 Boardwalk and Baseball Tournament in Florida, where they won the title and brought nationwide recognition to the CCBL by using wood bats, while the other collegiate summer teams competed with aluminum. Many of John's former players have enjoyed a career in pro baseball, continuing to this day in coaching, scouting, administrative and broadcasting roles.

John's college coaching career included Portland State College (OR), the University of Washington, and George Washington



University; he was inducted into the GW Hall of Fame in 2001. Since 1992, John has been a professional scout, beginning with the Florida Marlins (one World Series ring), followed by the Cincinnati Reds, Texas Rangers, Philadelphia Phillies (one World Series ring), and San Francisco

Giants (three World Series rings) where he is now the East Coast Supervisor. We are fortunate that John's scouting itinerary includes an annual trip to scout the CCBL. He and his wife Kate now own a home here, and John serves as an honorary director for the Firebirds. O








2016 CCBL SEASON REVIEW

YD RED SOX DEFEAT FALMOUTH TO RECORD THEIR THIRD CONSECUTIVE CAPE TITLE



The Firebirds congratulate the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox for winning their third consecutive Cape League title, beating the Falmouth Commodores in a three game Championship series. Last years title was the sixth for Y-D in the last 13 years, all behind veteran manager Scott Pickler. Despite losing their first five games, the Red Sox rallied to finish the regular season as the #2 seed in the Eastern Division playoffs. In round one they swept the Orleans Firebirds, pitting Y-D against #4 seed Cha-

tham, who upset heavily favored Harwich to advance. The Red Sox prompty swept the Anglers. In the Championship series the Red Sox met President's Trophy winning Falmouth. The Commodores won game one but again the Red Sox rallied to win the final two games, including game three 3-0 behind a standout performance by pitcher Bryan Sammons (Western Carolina). They were led by playoff MVP shortstop Kevin Smith (Maryland).







Welcome to historic Eldredge Park. Named "the best summer collegiate park in the nation," in 2004 by Baseball America, this picturesque park has served the town of Orleans now for 104 years. Over this time, substantial work has been completed to maintain, improve and modernize the park, most recently through private donations and without a single penny of local taxpayer support. Today, Eldredge Park provides the town with a beautiful facility and ambiance once described by Philadelphia Reporter Joe Parillo as "a Norman Rockwell painting come to life."

In 1913 a local gentleman named Lewis Winslow "Win" Eldredge (1861-1944) acquired about 250 acres of land in central Orleans in "consideration of my affection for and interest in the young people of Orleans and my desires to provide a playground for them."

In 1966, major steps were taken to modernize the park. The facility expanded to include a music band shell, tennis courts, picnic areas and other recreational facilities provided for in the master plan. Significantly, the field configuration was changed,

moving home plate from near the existing left-field foul pole to its current location. Coinciding with this reconfiguration, a new irrigation system was added, along with new soil. The "new" Eldredge Park was "an incredible diamond of velvet turf infield on a beautiful site." The new park debuted on July 23, 1967 when it hosted the Cape Cod League Baseball All-Star game. (See story on page 13) One of the most distinctive

elements of Eldredge Park is the steep hill that runs all the way down the right side of the field, which for years was almost impossible to sit on comfortably. That problem was solved in 1985 when Fred Perreault suggested terracing the entire hill, creating relatively level tiers on which fans could place chair and blankets. Now known as simply The Hill at Eldredge Park, this iconic feature expanded capacity to around 6000 and created a unique setting that is the envy of community ball parks throughout the country.

In 2004, the Yawkey Foundation began making a series of \$150,000 grants to each of the 10 CCBL teams. In 2009, Orleans and Yarmouth-Dennis became the last teams to receive grants.

Staged in phases, and with the addition of community donations, Eldredge Park underwent \$322,000 worth of improvements.

Phase 1 was completed in 2010 and involved construction of state-of-the-art 46' long dugouts, complete with New England styled bead boarding. A knee high padded brick backstop was built, new safety netting that extended 180' down each foul line was added and new foul poles and a flagpole in centerfield were erected.

Phase 2 was completed in 2011, focused on improving the playing surface. The entire infield was excavated to a level 5 feet underground, and then layered with new clay and sod. Sophisticated laser-guided instruments were used to level the field. Warning tracks were widened to 15' to conform to NCAA guidelines. Finally, both bullpens were fully restored to their original condition and the safety netting was raised another 20'.

Phase 3 was completed prior to the 2013 season and included a new sprinkler system. Fred Perreault and John Martin also cleared out two overgrown and unsightly groves, above the home

plate area and adjacent to the left field foul pole, greatly enhancing the expansive, open feel of the park. Finally, bleachers were converted from wood to aluminum and new sets were added beyond the outfield fence.

Before the 2017 season the visitors bullpen was expanded to accommodate two throwing lanes, a 214-foot long, 8-foot high "batter's eye" screened fence was erected beyond centerfield and additional safety netting was added for the home bullpen.

Over the last 100 years, Eldredge Park has served the town of Orleans in many ways. The town has coupled a vision with an unparalled commitment from residents, local business owners and countless volunteers to build, maintain and constantly improve the ballpark. George Mitrovich, a San Diego Civic Leader, summed up Eldredge Park in a 1998 Letter to the Boston Globe, "some teams play in ballparks with lights, some without. Some play in forgettable surroundings and some, like the Cardinals in Orleans, play in a sylvan setting so transcendently beautiful one's breath is swept

1967-2017 UYEARS at the "New" Eldredge Park

The 2017 season is a significant milestone in the history of the Orleans Firebirds and our beloved home field - Eldredge Park. This year marks the fiftieth anniversary of the dedication of the "new" Eldredge Park in 1967. Actually, the history of the Park goes back a lot further than that, and is only one year younger than another baseball shrine- Fenway Park.

In 1913, Lewis Winslow "Win" Eldredge had acquired 250 acres of land in central Orleans, and donated 10 acres "in consideration of my affection for and interest in the young people of Orleans and my desire to provide a playground for them". Thus began the saga of Eldredge Park. While the land continues to fulfill Win's vision of a playground, it has also become the playing field of some of the nation's most famous baseball players.

In 1966, major renovations

were instituted to modernize the park and the baseball field. The configuration of the field was rotated 90 degrees, with home plate being moved from what is now left field near the foul pole to where you see it today. New soil was brought in and the outfield was reseeded. Sod was laid in the infield, and the base paths were dug out and packed with six inches of clay. The pitcher's mound was re-done entirely in red clay, and the mound and home plate were stabilized

with wood blocks and plywood. Scores of recessed sprinklers were installed all over the field.

A Philadelphia sportswriter described the result as "A Norman Rockwell painting come to life". Len Merullo of the Chicago Cubs, one of ten major league scouts in attendance at the game, said "This is as good a ball field as you'll find anywhere, majors or minors." According to Orleans Selectman Charles F. Moore, the improvements were made at a cost of



\$30,000 "plus at least that amount in donated labor and material."

The "New" Eldredge Park was dedicated at the Cape Cod League All-Star Game played at the field on Sunday, July 23, 1967 when our Firebirds were known as the Cardinals. Prior to the ceremony, the nearly 2000 spectators were treated to a concert by the Orleans Band and an "old timers" batting exhibition. Massachusetts Governor John A. Volpe threw out the first honorary pitch, and was accompanied by Lt. Governor Francis Sargent and Attorney General Elliot Richardson. Governor Volpe arrived at the game by helicopter, landing at the nearby Nauset school field.

The significance of the day was best summed up by Governor Volpe in his remarks at the pregame ceremony:

"As Governor, I've had the pleasure many times of throwing out the first ball for the Red Sox, but I can say in all honesty that it gives me more satisfaction to do it today because you people were so willing to work for what you got. There's a lot of personal satisfaction in doing a job well. My congratulations to Charlie Moore, Art Finlay, Laurin Peterson, and everyone else who worked so hard for this."

The All-Star Game that followed was played under bright sunny skies after twenty successive days of fog and rain. Ed Baird of Chatham was the starter for the Lower Cape All Stars, and threw the first pitch of the game. He threw two scoreless innings on the way to a 9-1 victory for the Lower Cape team, which included Orleans players Terry DeWald, Steve Cashore, Chuck Seelback, and Jim Conlon.


Fifty years later, Ed Baird is still with the Chatham Anglers as their Treasurer and member of the Board of Directors. While with the arch rival Chatham team, Big Ed (as he was known in his playing days) is a true baseball fan and friend of the Firebirds, always willing to collaborate with us and provide assistance in the true spirit of community that the CCBL represents. Ed still has a great arm and will be throwing out the first pitch at our 50th year celebration of the "New" Eldredge Park. Ed's favorite venue away from Chatham, to this day, "is hands down Eldredge Park in Orleans."

The present day Firebirds organization is proud of our team, our coaches, our many dedicated volunteers, and our incredible heritage. We look forward to the next fifty years with enthusiasm, optimism, and confidence in this great community effort. O







Orleans is indeed fortunate to welcome Coach Nicholson back for his 17th summer here - his 13th as Field Manager, the longest tenure for an Orleans skipper in the "modern era" (1963-present).

Kelly (or Coach K as he's known in the pitching fraternity) is a native of Corona, California where he won numerous scholarathlete awards in both baseball and basketball while in high school. He was a four-year letterwinner and two-time all-conference pick during his pitching career at Loyola Marymount University.

After earning his bachelor's degree in business administration from LMU, he began his career teaching mathematics at Loyola High School of Los Angeles, while completing his master's degree in education from LMU. He was the head coach of the Loyola HS Cubs for eleven seasons, where he led the team to seven playoff appearances and a league title. Kelly then spent three seasons as Loyola Marymount's pitching coach, and each year the Lions won the WCC title and went to the NCAA regionals. In the summer of 2000, Kelly worked with the Team USA pitching staff in its early preparation for international play. Kelly joined Orleans as the pitching coach in 2001. In 2002, Coach K's staff had a 2.11 ERA (the best ever by Cardinals pitchers) and in 2004 it led the CCBL with a 2.37. His 2003 championship pitching staff was lights out, with a 2.36 ERA and a league-leading 397 Ks in 401 IP. All told, Kelly's pitching staffs have led the CCBL in ERA an astounding 7 times.


Spirit Award with Coach Steve DeBlasi in 2004, Kelly became the field manager in 2005, and was the unanimous choice of his fellow managers for the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year Award after leading the Cardinals to a record-setting 30-win season and the championship. Coach K was again named Manager of the Year in 2008 as his squad finished the regular season in first place overall (25-17-2), but a heartbreaking 1-0, 18-inning loss to the eventual CCBL Champion Harwich Mariners ended the team's playoff run. Under his leadership, Orleans is a perennial playoff contender. In 2015, Kelly led the Firebirds to a franchise record of 31-12-1 (.716) and again was named the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year. Coach K's overall regular season winning percentage of .570 leads all active CCBL Managers.

It's no surprise to anyone who knows him that Kelly enjoys the respect, affection and admiration of his players, fellow coaches and colleagues here and around the league and in the wider baseball community; he's a favorite around town, having made countless friends over the years. Orleans fans know they'll see a first class team on the field every summer with Kelly at the helm.

Kelly established his "ABC" or Academy of Baseball and Character, where young players "learn to play the game the right way." We can attest to that. Orleans welcomes a true gentleman and a terrific leader back for his seventeenth summer. Kelly is engaged to Donna Barney and resides in Playa del Rey, CA. O


oach Craig returns for his 9th season as the team's primary hitting coach and he'll also run the offense.

Robert Bremner

NOVEMBER 19, 1926 - FEBRUARY 22, 2017



Born in Osterville, Bob moved to Orleans with his family when he was three years old and graduated Orleans

High School in 1944. After serving in the US Air Force for three years, he entered Kansas State, where he played baseball. After graduating in 1951, he taught school and coached in Kansas and Delaware for many years, and spent summers playing baseball for Orleans back in the town team years; he and his older brother Dave were members of the renowned 1954 team which competed in the National Baseball Congress Tournament in Wichita, Kansas. When Bob and his wife Dottie returned to Orleans full time, he worked at Goose Hummock and then Ocean Edge until his retirement. Along with other town team alum, he was a regular on the bench outside the post office, greeting his many friends and talking baseball.

The Firebirds join the Cape League in marking the passing of former Commissioner Marr, who devoted his life to

learning, teaching, coaching, mentoring, and creating opportunities for his students. Dick was a graduate of The Governor's Academy, Williams College, and Middlebury College's Bread Loaf School of English. While at Williams, he was an All-East hockey goaltender and varsity baseball

player. At Milton Academy, Dick taught English and served as hockey and baseball coach, dorm master and director of admissions and financial aid. At Tabor Academy, he was dean of students and the first girls' hockey and softball coach, and he also headed Tabor's speech and debate programs. In 1995, he was inducted into the Massachusetts High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame; he also served as supervisor of ice hockey officials for the ECAC and

Hockey East. After retiring from Tabor, Dick returned to baseball, working with the Cape League as its commissioner. He then earned a JD degree from Roger Williams School of Law, and served as an investigator and mediator for local courts. Dick and his wife Ginny spent winters in North Carolina, and he assisted with the men's hockey teams at both Duke and UNC until his death.

CATCHING UP WITH YANKUS

TOM YANKUS HAS BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH ORLEANS FOR MORE THAN 50 YEARS, AS A PLAYER, MANAGER AND ASSISTANT COACH. **WE RECENTLY SPOKE** WITH HIM AFTER HE **RETURNED FROM CALIFORNIA WHERE HE WAS WITH THE WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY BASEBALL TEAM FOR SPRING TRAINING.**

What is your current role with the Weslevan team?

I spend my time in the bullpen. I don't do much, but I talk to the pitchers, try to get them ready to go in, act as a calming influence. Wide- eyed kids are out there going, "oh boy" before heading into a tight game. I try to keep them focused and relaxed. That mound

is a lonely place.

Dresser Diamond at Andrus Field, home to Weslevan baseball, has a terraced Hill similar to Eldredge Park. Can you describe that setting?

The field sits in the middle of campus and is rimmed by all these beautiful buildings from the 1800's, plus the new dining hall. It's a wonderful little pocket. Wesleyan is a superb place to play

In addition to serving as head baseball coach at Choate Rosemary Hall in Wallingford, CT, you also taught English there, for 57 years. Can you talk about the importance and value of good writing today, especially in this age of social media?

There is just the same concentration on writing as always. The Elements of Style, called "The Little Book," contained all of these memorable bits of advice that E.B. White hammered into us: "omit needless words," "clarity, clarity, clarity." Certainly, social media helps to keep sentences terse and concise.

I worked so hard telling the kids to use good verbs and to be economical in their writing. At the end of the year they'd groan that they were tired of hearing me talk about good verbs. I'd say fine, I'm glad you're tired of it because that means I drew enough atten-

After a distinguished career at Williams College, you signed with the New York Yankees in 1956. Word is you crossed paths with Mickey Mantle. Is that true?

I did, yes. The day I signed at Yankee Stadium, they told me to bring my spikes and a glove, and they'll give me the rest for the tryout. So I got to the Yankee locker room, and I didn't have a long- sleeve, blue undershirt. And Mickey was getting dressed and saw I didn't have a shirt, and he said "Here, kid" and threw his over to me, with his "Mickey Mantle #7" embroidered on the back. I said to myself, should I touch it? That was the year he won the Triple Crown (.353 batting average with 52 home runs and 130 RBI). He was a big-time player and called me "kid," even though we were the same age. I was just out of college, and he was Mr. Established Yankee. I was "Kid." and he was "The Mick."

You were assigned to play that summer for the Missoula Timberiacks of the Pioneer League, where you served as the pitcher/ bus driver for that club. How did that

One afternoon during our stay in Billings, Joe Abernathy, our third baseman and bus driver, asked if I wanted to learn how to drive the bus up around the airport. I said sure. The next day he left for home in North Carolina, letting the GM know that I could drive the bus. I was behind the wheel of the ancient bus for the rest of the season, creeping up one side of the Rockies and then barreling down the other at perilous speeds. It didn't bother me then. Twenty-two years old and hugging immortality.

With the Timberjacks you played for the legendary Jack McKeon (two-time MLB Manager of the Year: winner of 1051 games as a big league manager, for five different teams). What did he mean to you

He kind of took me on as an adopted son. Even though he had a son, Casey, he and his wife Carol, would have me over for dinner. We were out in the middle of nowhere as far as I was concerned, somewhere in Montana, I didn't know anybody. They both recognized I was a little bit lonely, and they'd have me over for spaghetti on a regular basis.

Jack was a player/manager. You couldn't bunt him to second base. He had these huge calves and couldn't run. I used to give him a dollar before I pitched. I said I'll pay the fine now because I can't bunt you to second base. He laughed about things, one of those guys who didn't take things too seriously and he wasn't on an ego trip. I learned a lesson from him that helped me coaching later: it's not about you, it's all about the players. They're trying to get somewhere, and you're just the funnel.

Fifty years later, our family was in Florida, the Choate baseball team was down there for spring training, and Jack was managing Tampa Bay. We were at Holman Stadium at the Dodgers complex.

Tampa Bay was in for a game, and I said to my wife Julie, "I'm going to say hello to Jack. He won't remember me, but what the heck?" So the team was walking along

> in front of the right field stands, and I yelled out "Hey, Jack" and he yelled back "Hey, Lefty!"

After 50 years, with all the players he's coached at all levels of professional baseball,

it was remarkable. My younger daughter Alex, about six at the time, had asked Julie, "If he doesn't remember, will daddy be sad?" Jack remembered.

In the late 1990's you wrote a book entitled "Montana Summer" (Xlibris Publishing, 2000), chronicling that summer with the Timberjacks. There are so many wonderful and vivid scenes that come to life in that book. Did you go to a special place to best connect with those memories and feelings?

I wrote that book one summer while up on the Cape, and the pictures and stories would just pop up. I followed that lead and tried to make it something other people would enjoy.

Your book recently got in the hands of Ron Shelton (Oscar nominated film director and screenwriter: directed the classic baseball film "Bull Durham"). How did that happen and what's the latest on a possible movie adaption of Montana Summer?

I taught a young man back in the 60's who is now a director of independent films out in LA. He had read the book and passed it on to his friend Rob Ryder, a scriptwriter, who read the book, thought it had possibilities as a movie and said he was going to show it to Ron Shelton. (He had helped Ron write "White Guys Can't Jump" and served as a technical advisor for that movie). After reading it, Ron said he was interested. I am not holding my breath.

How did you begin playing with the Orleans Cardinals in the Cape League?

It started because of an alumni

reunion at Williams College. I asked John Sargent what he was doing for the summer, and he said he was playing in the Cape League. John put me in touch with Buzzy Wilcox, the player/ manager, and I became a Cardifrom 1990-94) nal. It was in 1963. That was before Eldredge Park was renovated, reconfigured. It was basically a hard scrabble diamond back then. At one point, Chief Landers Home plate was over by the police station. They had snow fences in

The crowds would support both teams. I'd never seen that before. They'd clap for good plays, they loved the game. They were supporters of the Cardinals, but they wouldn't go crazy. Chatham was the complete opposite. Their fans were really tough on the opposing players.

I played for three seasons before the league became an official NCAA summer league. I then began playing in Quebec, Canada in

During your playing career in Orleans (1963-5) did you play for manager Dave

I did. Yeah. He was a great guy to play for. After our first loss at Cotuit on opening day in '63, he pulled us together and called us "the raggedy-ass cadets." We knew he meant business. Terrific game manager. (Gavitt went on to help form the Big East Conference and served as the Boston Celtics CEO

For a time you were a "summer cop" in Orleans. What do you recall about those

was on a big kick about cars without mufflers or those with faulty mufflers. He hated the racket. I had a Porsche with a bad muffler. so I used to hide it in the woods behind the Police Station. When we came into work, we used to put our keys on a board by the front door. At lunch time the Chief would grab a rookie and tell him to grab some keys off the rack, take someone's car and take him home for lunch. One day I'm out on patrol, out on Brick Hill Road, waiting to go out onto Beach Road, and I hear this roaring coming over the hill from town. I thought "OK, that guy is getting as ticket!" Then I see it's my Porsche, with a rookie driving, and the Chief in the passenger seat, hiding under the dashboard. I went to NAPA the next day.

They didn't give me a gun in my first year. I used to keep candy bars in my holster, and I had a whistle, but no gun. So the second year I go to my locker and there's a shiny .38 pistol, with six extra bullets lying on the shelf. For the first three weeks I'd get into the cruiser gingerly, trying to avoid shooting my foot off. And one day I decided to open the bullet chamber and see how many bullets I had in the thing. Well, it was empty. Those six bullets were not extras.

After your playing days conclude, you become head coach of the Orleans Cardinals (1974-80). How did that come to be?

I think Russ Ford had a lot to do with it. I was working with the outfielders one day and noticed a man standing on the side, listening to my spiel. I thought he was a tourist with nothing better to do than watch practice. After I was done, he came over and said 'I like the way you handle those players, the things you say to them." That was Russ. Having just moved to the Cape, he became fascinated with the brand of ball and was named president of the Cardinals and eventually the entire league. He backed me for the Orleans head job.

Later you served as an assistant coach for Orleans, first for Jack Donahue, then John

Yeah, I threw BP seven days a week for Jack and loved every minute of it. It was also a great workout.. It was a great workout. My arm survived, but that was a lot of BP for the summer. I loved it.

For Castleberry, I was up on the "deck" (band shell stage), by the bullpen with a walkie-talkie. It connected me to the dugout, but it also connected me to the fishing boats in the Bay. John would call out to get so-and-so to warm up, and you'd hear this voice -"What's that? We're in the inlet, got a full load of blues comin' in."

Over those years you coached many great players in Orleans, including Frank Thomas. Do you recall anything special about Frank?

Well, Frank was good friends with Bo Jackson, when he was at Auburn, I think they were roommates. Bo signed with Kansas City, Frank, a year younger, came to Orleans. Bo gave him a couple of Louisville bats. Frank kept them in a flower box, with tissue paper and everything, as if they were trophies or something. He wouldn't use them. But then late in August, the last week of the season, he said he's going to use one of those bats tonight. If he broke it, Frank would get another one from Bo the next day when KC came to play the Red Sox. He'd hit only one home run up to that point, this huge guy. With that bat he hit three home runs, at Wareham, a huge field. The first ball sailed far over the left field bleachers into the parking lot, the next over the center field fence into the mist, and the third about fifty feet over the right field fence. Frank ended up hitting only four home runs that summer.

Another superstar was Ben McDonald (selected first overall in the '89 MLB draft). who played a short time for Orleans over the '89 summer while his agent Scott Boras was negotiating with the Orioles. What do you remember about Ben?

He waited quite a while for Boras to do his job. I think his dad said why don't you go up and pitch in the Cape League. So he came up. I remember the first night he showed up, at Yarmouth. He was throwing a bullpen session and would tell me every pitch and throw it exactly where he wanted. I just remember his control was perfect. The next night, he was going to go a couple of innings. The crowd around Eldredge Park must have been in the thousands, including two hundred fans who watched him warm up in the bullpen. He went 4 innings, gave



up one hit and of course, looked very impressive. He lasted a week in Orleans before he signed with Baltimore. The day before he accepted a million dollar bonus, he was raking the infield for \$3.75 an

That first night in the bullpen in Yarmouth, Ben had asked, "Where can I get squirrel?" I told him they were all over the place, look in your backyard. No, he said, to eat. "Where do I get squirrel to eat?" I said you don't get it around here.

Are there any memorable plays at Eldredge Park that stick with you to this

Well, the centerfield fence at Eldredge is 434 feet, a bigger park than even Wareham. There was a pitcher from Chatham, Chuck Rodgers. He's the only guy I ever saw hit one over that part of the fence. It was an amazing shot, a Mickey Mantle shot, had to be over 480 feet, high over the 434 sign and rising.

The other play was in '05, when we won the CCBL championship. It was against Chatham in a playoff game. Emmanuel Burriss, one of our infielders, was on 3rd base, either in extra innings or the bottom of the 9th. It was a tie game. There was a foul pop up, over by first base, near the far end of the dugout. I'll never forget this moment. Burriss tagged up and beat the throw home. On a pop up to the first baseman. Game over.

You've been around Orleans for many years now ("I haven't missed a summer since 1962"). It's been a big part of your life. What does this town mean to you?

It's just small enough or large enough, that I know more people here than I do at home (in Wallingford, CT). I feel more a native of Orleans than I do of Wallingford. It's a small town atmosphere that grows on you.

You've spent over 50 years now at this wonderful jewel known as Eldredge Park. On game nights you're usually sitting in a lawn chair "on the deck" (band shell), with friends Ron (Conte) and Dave (Mitchell). eating popcorn and peanuts. Do you ever reflect on what this setting means to you,



scene. Then slowly the lights blink on, dusk comes, and then nightfall. It's that changeover I remember so vividly, from the first time we had those lights. It's always a wonderful time to be alive on a warm July night with a ballgame to watch. O -Stu Murray


