



WEST DIVISION

BOURNE BRAVES

Doran Park, Upper Cape Tech, 220 Sandwich Road, Bourne

www.bournebraves.org | Take Route 6 to Exit 1. Bear right off the exit and take a left on Ben Abbey Road. At the end of Ben Abbey Road, turn left on Sandwich Road (Route 6). Proceed along the canal. After the ice rink, the school driveway is on the left. The field is up the steep driveway behind the school.

COTUIT KETTLEERS

Lowell Park, 10 Lowell Street, Cotuit

www.kettleers.org | Take Route 6 to Exit 5 (Route 149). Bear left at end of ramp onto Route 149. Stay to the right until the end. Bear right onto Route 28. Turn left on Putnam. Follow to Lowell Avenue on the right. The parking lot and field is on the right.

FALMOUTH COMMODORES

Guv. Fuller Field, 790 Main Street, Falmouth Center

www.falmouthcommodores.com | Take Route 6 to Exit 5 (Route 149). Bear left at the end of ramp onto Route 149. Stay to the right on Route 149 until the end. Bear right onto Route 28. Continue on Route 28 through Mashpee Rotary to Falmouth Center. The field is on the right behind the police station.

HYANNIS HARBOR HAWKS

www.harborhawks.org | Take Route 6 to Exit 7 (Willow Street). Bear left at the end of ramp. Follow Willow through lights across Route 28 onto Yarmouth Road. Turn right at the end onto Main Street. Keep in left lane on Main Street to High School Road Ext which dead-ends at the field.

Clem Spillane Field, 54 Marion Road at Viking Drive, Wareham

Take Route 25 across the bridge and proceed to Exit 2 (Glen Charlie Road to Route 6, Wareham). After passing through Wareham Center, Route 6 bears left up a hill. BREWSTER WHITECAPS CAPTURE LEAGUE CROWN



The Orleans Firebirds finished first in the East with 58 points (29-15-0), as well as capturing the President's Trophy for most points during regular season. The Falmouth Commodores captured the West Division with 49 points. First round of the playoffs saw third round against Chatham 2 games to 1. In the West, Wareham swept top seed Falmouth. Orleans faced off against Brewster for the East Division crown, which saw Brewster come from



Welcome to historic Eldredge Park. Named "the best summer collegiate park in the nation," in 2004 by Baseball America, this picturesque park has served the town of Orleans for over a century. Over this time, substantial work has been completed to maintain, improve and modernize the park, most recently through private donations and without a single penny of local taxpayer support. Today, Eldredge Park provides the town with a beautiful facility and ambiance once described by Philadelphia Inquirer Reporter Joe Parillo as "a Norman Rockwell painting come to life."

In 1913 a local gentleman named Lewis Winslow "Win" Eldredge (1861-1944) acquired about 250 acres of land in central Orleans; he designated a portion as a park, in "consideration of my affection for and interest in the young people of Orleans and my desires to provide a playground for them."

In 1966, major steps were taken to modernize the park. The facility expanded to include a music band shell, tennis courts, picnic areas and other recreational facilities provided for in the master plan. Significantly, the

field configuration was changed, moving home plate from near the existing left-field foul pole to its current location. Coinciding with this reconfiguration, a new irrigation system was added, along with new soil. The "new" Eldredge Park was "an incredible diamond of velvet turf infield on a beautiful site." The new park debuted on July 23, 1967 when it hosted the Cape Cod League Baseball All-Star game. One of the most distinctive

elements of Eldredge Park is the steep hill that runs all the way down the right side of the field, which for years was almost impossible to sit on comfortably. That problem was solved in 1985 when Fred Perreault suggested terracing the entire hill, creating relatively level tiers on which fans could place chair and blankets. Now known as simply The Hill at Eldredge Park, this iconic feature expanded capacity to around 6000 and created a unique setting that is the envy of community ball parks throughout the country.

In 2004, the Yawkey Foundation began making a series of \$150,000 grants to each of the 10 CCBL teams. In 2009, Orleans and Yarmouth-Dennis became

the last teams to receive grants. Staged in phases, and with the addition of community donations, Eldredge Park underwent \$322,000 worth of improve-

Phase 1 was completed in 2010 and involved construction of state-of-the-art 46' long dugouts, complete with New England styled bead boarding. A knee high padded brick backstop was built, new safety netting that extended 180' down each foul line was added and new foul poles and a flagpole in centerfield were erected.

Phase 2 was completed in 2011, focused on improving the playing surface. The entire infield was excavated to a level 5 feet underground, and then layered with new clay and sod. Sophisticated laser-guided instruments were used to level the field. Warning tracks were widened to 15' to conform to NCAA guidelines. Finally, both bullpens were fully restored to their original condition and the safety netting was raised another 20'.

Phase 3 was completed prior to the 2013 season and included a new sprinkler system. Fred Perreault and John Martin also cleared out two overgrown and


unsightly groves, above the home plate area and adjacent to the left field foul pole, greatly enhancing the expansive, open feel of the park. Finally, bleachers were converted from wood to aluminum and new sets were added beyond the outfield fence.

Before the 2017 season the visitors bullpen was expanded to accommodate two throwing lanes, a 214-foot long, 8-foot high "batter's eve" screened fence was erected beyond centerfield and additional safety netting was added for the home bullpen.

Over the past century, Eldredge Park has served the town of Orleans in many ways. The town has coupled a vision with an unparalled commitment from residents, local business owners and countless volunteers to build, maintain and constantly improve the ballpark. George Mitrovich, a San Diego Civic Leader, summed up Eldredge Park in a 1998 letter to the Boston Globe, "some teams play in ballparks with lights, some without. Some play in forgettable surroundings and some, like the Cardinals in Orleans, play in a sylvan setting so transcendently beautiful one's breath is swept away."

ORLEANS WINS 1993 CCBL CHAMPIONSHIP



It was quite a season: the team had some now famous MLB players, a regular season race that went down to the wire, a tiebreaker win against Brewster to get in the playoffs, a close division championship series with Chatham, topped off by a sweep over the Wareham

Gatemen to clinch the League Championship. It was all made possible by an Orleans victory in a crazy game late in the season, more on that later. While all Orleans was hopeful of a strong season, the team and coaches were still in a building mode. As Dave Mulholland, the team's GM, said, "Heck, it was only two years ago that we were suffering through a miserable 13-31 season."

The Orleans 1993 Cape Cod Baseball League season began on June 11 against Brewster with Rolando Casanova as Field Manager. Casanova was the defensive coach, base running instructor and recruiting coordinator for Florida International University. He was backed up by First Base Coach Jon Bunnell of Eastern Connecticut (who lived in North Eastham and was a bullpen catcher for the team when he was at Nauset High) and Pitching Coach Tony Casas of Lynn University. Mike Iacuessa of the Cave Codder reported on June 13 that "The Orleans Cardinals organization has worked hard in the off-season to pull its share of crowd attractions. Most notable among them are Anthony Nomar Garciaparra, who was the starting shortstop for the U.S. Olympic Team last summer and set a Georgia Tech stolen base record this spring; and USC third baseman/ shortstop Aaron Boone, the grandson of Ray, son of Bob and brother of Bret". The Cardinals and Firebirds are the same franchise of the CCBL – the name of the team was changed in 2009.] Coach Casanova was optimistic. The day before the season started he said, "The chemistry's been pretty good. You can have all the talent in the world, but it doesn't mean a thing if you don't have any chemistry."

The Season Begins

Despite all the hope, the season started off with a 6-0 loss to the Whitecaps. Things then turned up for the Orleans nine as they had a 5-2 away victory over Wareham, followed by a 6-3 come from behind victory over Falmouth at home. Orleans had a chance to even their record with Chatham on the July 4 game, but lost to Chatham, 4-3, and fell to third place with Brewster in the lead. Approaching the halfway point on July 8, Brewster was a game up with a record of 13-7-1 to Orleans at 12-8-1. Brewster and Orleans dominated the bat-

ting in the League. Brewster had Geoff Blum at .394 and Steve Pulco at .333. Orleans countered with Nomar Garciaparra at .388 and Lionel Hastings at .353.


A week later the standings had tightened with Orleans going with four wins versus a loss putting Brewster and Orleans tied at 16-9-1. Chatham at 13-13 was in third place. Wareham protested a game on July 17 which caused the Cardinals to "win" it twice (see sidebar). Three days later, the team had a big scare in a game against Falmouth when key players Lionel Hastings and Jay Payton collided when trying to catch a fly ball, resulting in a trip for both to Falmouth Hospital. Payton required 17 stitches and Hastings had a badly torn lip, but they both quickly returned to the lineup.

A few days later, the Eastern Division race tightened further. Chatham, which had been lackluster, caught fire with three additional wins as part of a six game winning streak including a win over the Cardinals, as John Schiffner took over midseason as Field Manager. (John retired at the end of the 2017 season after 25 years at the helm. The Firebirds honored John with a first pitch at the last game of the 2017 regular season.) Orleans and Brewster were both at 17 wins with Chatham one behind at 16!

The next day, July 21, the Cardinals and Brewster were deadlocked 3 to 3 until the seventh inning. Orleans put together a series of hits that led to a 6 – 3 victory and finally gave them the lead in the Eastern Division.

At the All Star Game, the West All-Stars pounded out 13 hits for a 9-3 victory over the East divi-

sion. Over 50 scouts in attendance elected Wareham's Roy Marsh of Ohio State the MVP of the game. Marsh banged out four hits in his five times at bat, tying a league record. Another strong performer for the West was future Red Sox great Jason Varitek of Hyannis. With the score 2-2 in the third frame, Ryan Frace of Orleans gave up two runs that tagged him as the losing pitcher. Orleans led the Eastern Division with six All-Star picks: Nomar, Aaron Boone, Lionel Hastings, starting pitchers Ryan Frace and Clint Fair, and reliever Bob Bigelli.

Race to the Playoffs

On July 29 the Cards were back in first place with a two point lead on Brewster. Unfortunately, as July turned to August, there was bad news. Chatham and Brewster were all winning just as the Cardinals were in a tailspin with three losses in a row including back-to-back losses to Brewster in a home and away games series on July 31 and August 1, and to top things off, Nomar had the flu.

As dawn broke on August 5, Brewster was in first place, a point ahead of Chatham, with Orleans in third place back another point. It was all coming down to the last night of the season – Brewster at Chatham and Orleans at Harwich. Orleans had no choice but to win, and they did, 9-4, despite spotting Harwich 4 runs in the first inning. However, the Brewster-Chatham game was postponed due to fog. A Brewster win meant the end of the season for the Orleans nine.

The 1993 Team

Nomar Garciaparra was a fan favorite on the Boston Red Sox for nine years and had five additional seasons with the Cubs, Dodgers and A's. In addition to being the 1997 American League Rookie of the Year, he was a six time MLB All Star, had a lifetime .313 batting average, and led the American League in batting for 1999 and 2000. He also is the only player ever to hit two grand slams in one day in his home park. On March 10, 2010, after the 2009 season with Oakland, Nomar signed a one-day contract with the Boston Red Sox to enable him to retire as a member of the Red Sox. In 2003, Nomar married Olympian and World Cup soccer star Mia Hamm. Since 2014 he has been behind the microphone for the Dodgers, serving as an analyst for game broadcasts and preand- post-game telecasts. Nomar was inducted into the Cape League's Hall of Fame in 2002.

Aaron Boone (USC), now in his rookie year as Manager of the New York Yankees, had a twelve season career primarily with the Reds. Within the Yankee – Red Sox rivalry he is famous (infamous) for his 11th inning walk-off home run during Game 7 of the 2003 American League Championship Series which gave the Yankees a 6–5 victory over the Red Sox and former Orleans teammate Nomar, thereby prolonging the "Curse of the Bambino." The victory put the Yankees into the World Series against the Florida Marlins.

Nomar and Aaron weren't the only eventual Major Leaguers on the 1993 team. Jay Payton played for Orleans in both the 1992 and 1993 seasons. He had a .468 average (with a 27 game hitting streak) and set a school record for 11 triples in a season in his sophomore year at Georgia Tech. In 2000, his official rookie year, Jay helped lead the Mets to a World Series berth as the starting centerfielder. He finished third in the Rookie of the Year voting. Jay played with several teams in his 12 year major league career and had a lifetime

.279 average. Today he is a hitting instructor in Edmond, OK.

Greg LaRocca, a UMass grad, played infield three years in the majors – with San Diego and Cleveland. He then had a distinguished career in Japan with the Hiroshima Carp, Yakult Swallows and Orix Buffaloes hitting .288. Greg now runs the Baseball Barn in Bedford, NH where he provides advanced instruction in hitting and fielding for both individuals and teams.

Rob Stanifer, a right-handed pitcher also had three seasons in the majors, two with the Marlins, including the 1997 World Champion team, and one with the Red Sox. Rob went to Anderson University and is a member of their Hall of Fame. Currently, he is the head varsity baseball coach for Northeast High School Vikings of St. Petersburg, Florida.

The sixth man to make the majors on the team was Mike Welch a right-handed pitcher who was born in Haverhill, MA. In 1991, Mike helped lead Southern Maine to the NCAA Division III National Championship. Drafted by the New York Mets, Mike Welch had a successful minor league career followed by the 1998 season with the Philadelphia Phillies.

Lionel Hastings, a teammate of Aaron Boone at USC, was drafted by the Florida Marlins in 1994. He played three years on the Portland Sea Dogs and had two years in AAA ball at Charlotte in the International League and Calgary in the Pacific Coast League.

Chris Ciaccio was a pitcher on the Cards hailing from the University of Georgia. Drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in 1993, he chose to continue his college career instead. Today he's the Vice President of Sales, Marketing and Merchandise for IMG Academy, a premier multi-sport training and education facility in Bradenton, Florida.

Native son Jon Bunnell, who started his tenure



Chatham's 7-5 win the next afternoon gained them home field advantage for the East Division playoff with a record of 25-19 (50 points). Brewster, as a result of the loss, ended the season in a tie with Orleans for the second playoff spot - both had a record of 23-20-1 (47 points). As a result of the tie, an afternoon game was scheduled the next day, August 6, to determine who would be Chatham's opponent in the first game of the Eastern Division Championship series that evening.

Tie Breaker in Brewster

It turned out to be a good after-

noon for the Cardinals. The Cape Cod Times summed up the Orleans ninth as follows: "With the Whitecaps holding a 4-2 advantage, the Orleans bats came to life." Orleans "led off with a single and scored on a double ... Doug Lowe laid down a bunt and reached for an infield hit." After Brewster got an out, "Jay Payton lined a clean single to center... scoring the tying run". In the 11th frame with one man on, Jay Payton hit a homer over the Cape Cod Tech left field fence giving Orleans a 6-4 victory and entry to the playoffs. Bob O'Donnell, who attended the game, still remembers the Payton home run as a laser shot "10 feet off ground from home plate to left field fence". [Payton had played for the Cardinals in 1992 and was coming off a Georgia Tech season with a .468 average. That said, he was



off to a slow start during the 1993 Cape season. He had just one hit in 28 bats during his first nine games and in the 44 game regular season had only one home run! He never seemed frustrated, but just kept showing up early for practice and came alive at just the right time.

Eastern Division Champion Series with Chatham

The Cardinals were in the playoffs! The next challenge was getting past Chatham - not an easy task given the A's were hot. As it turns out, Jay Payton was even hotter. Per the Cape Cod Times' Tim Molloy, "With the score knotted at 1, and both pitchers, Chatham's Jess Gonzalez and Chris Ciaccio of Orleans, mowing down the opposing batters, Payton took matters into his own hands in the top of the ninth. With the count at 1-0.

Orleans Wins a Key Late Season Game Twice!

In a strange game against Wareham on July 17, Rolando Casanova had visited the mound twice in the eighth inning, which forced him to send Rob Stanifer, the Orleans pitcher, to right field and replace him with Andy Thompson, the right fielder, who had done several instances of relief pitching. Thompson got the last out of the eighth in two pitches to end the inning. When designated hitter Steve Fishman came to the plate in the ninth with one out, Wareham lodged a protest saying that Orleans had lost their DH by putting their pitcher in the field. At the time the Cards were down by a score of 1-0 with Lionel Hastings on first. Fishman sacrificed moving Hasting to second. Andy Thompson then singled him in tying the game. In the 12th inning, Orleans scored four more runs to seemingly win the game. A few days later the League Commissioner agreed with Wareham and ruled the game would have to be replayed from the end of the eighth inning.

When the game resumed on July 24, the Cards were back to the end of the eighth, down a run with only two outs left to turn the game around. With a runner on first and Thompson at the plate, the Wareham pitcher hung a pitch that broke right over the plate and Thompson put it out of Eldredge! GM Dave Mulholland called it "the most dramatic moment in Cardinals' history". So, the Gateman pitcher who had been 6 and 0 was now 6 and 1, and Thompson was then 1 and 0 as a result of his own home run and gained a 2-1 win for Orleans. Little did anyone know at that point that this win would be critical for Orleans to have a chance to make the playoffs. •

the slugger from Georgia Tech hit a fastball from Gonzalez well over the left field fence for a 2-1 lead." Ciaccio shut down the A's in the ninth and the Cards were up one game to none. Jeff Blanchard of the Cape Codder noted that it was "a night of great fielding - by Aaron Boone, by Nomar Garciaparra, by Lionel Hastings, by Jay Payton and tough always around-the-plate pitching by the Card's Chris Ciaccio." Ciaccio pitched a complete game with no walks and eight strikeouts.

Saturday, August 7 was the A's day. The Chatham starter, Scott Schoeneweis, held the Cards to only three hits and two walks in eight innings, picking up seven strikeouts. The A's collected four runs on six hits against Cardinals ace Ryan France (7-1 in the regular season) including a tworun homer that went into the Eldredge Park playground. Orleans lost to Chatham 4-0.

The rubber match occurred

at Chatham's Veteran's Field the following day. Bob Bigelli, from Springfield College, who had made the All-Star team as a reliever, was the starter. Bigelli didn't move into the starting rotation until late in the season. He struck out eight, gave up no walks and only five hits. Per the Cape Cod Times' Molloy, "The only time [Chatham] got a runner past first base was in the sixth when they collected three of their five hits and scored their only run." It was a 7-1 Orleans victory including two dingers by Orleans' Doug Lowe in his first two at bats. Nomar went 4 for 4, Hastings went 2 for 3 and Boone went 2 for 4 for the Cards. Orleans advanced to play Wareham the following night.

League Championship Series

On August 10, the game was in Wareham. The Gatemen were

the winner of the President's Trophy for the most points of any team in the league - their record was 25-17-2. They had beaten the Hyannis Mets in two games, 4-3 and 5-2, and were well rested.

In the top of the first with two on and two out, Aaron Boone hit a double over the left fielder's head, scoring two runs. In the third the Orleans starter gave up a run and was replaced by reliever Rob Stanifer. Stanifer got the final out with the bases loaded and put out the rally. From there Stanifer kept the Gatemen scoreless for the remaining six innings and got the 2-1 victory. It was a tough night for Wareham pitcher Mike Drumright who had 11 strikeouts and held the Cards to just three hits, but he had been the victim of poor run support during the entire Wareham season.

The following day the series moved to Orleans. The Cardinals had been an away team during 1993, winning 15 on the road and compiling only 6 losses. Eldredge, as friendly a park as there is, was not kind to them. Before the game, five of the players tried to exorcise the demons by dressing for an away game and riding






around the town for 45 minutes. Upon their return, they convinced the remainder of the team to meet them halfway - home jerseys, but gray away pants which they then wore in the game. According to the Cape Codder, GM Dave Mulholland said' "It was ugly. But it worked." the playoffs.

Three thousand fans were at Eldredge for the second game ready to cheer for the Cardinals, and they had plenty to cheer about. The Cards loaded the bases in the second with a hit batter and two walks, but a pick-off by the Gatemen snuffed the rally. In the home half of third inning, a bunt followed by a steal put a man on second with no outs. Lionel Hastings hit a bloop single that was booted by the Wareham center fielder. When the dust cleared the Cards had scored a run and Hastings was on third. Two outs later, Aaron Boone hit a grounder to short but a wide throw to first didn't get Boone and the Cards were on top 2-0.

The Gatemen managed to get a run in their fourth on a single, a steal to second, a sacrifice to third and a groundout to get the runner home. In the bottom of the sixth, a two out 300-foot homer down the left field line by Cardinals' catcher Steve Fishman gave the

By staying ahead of batters, Ciaccio had pitched a four hit gem with four walks and eight strikeouts, and as a result received the MVP award of the series. Only one Wareham runner made it past second base and there was never more than one base runner in an inning due to Ciaccio's performance and excellent fielding by Boone, Garciaparra, Hastings and Payton.

Coach Casanova summed it up by saying that team chemistry counts as much as great players. "From the very first day we had 18 to 20 players who seemed to know each other and generally liked each other's company. That made such a big difference." O

Orleans is indeed fortunate to welcome Coach Nicholson back for his 18th summer here - his 14th as Field Manager, the longest tenure for an Orleans skipper in the "modern era" (1963-present).

Kelly (or Coach K as he's known in the pitching fraternity) is a native of Corona, California where he won numerous scholarathlete awards in both baseball and basketball while in high school. He was a four-year letterwinner and two-time all-conference pick during his pitching career at Loyola Marymount University.

After earning his bachelor's degree in business administration from LMU, he began his career teaching mathematics at Loyola High School of Los Angeles, while completing his master's degree in education from LMU. He was the head coach of the Loyola HS Cubs for eleven seasons, where he led the team to seven playoff appearances and a league title. Kelly then spent three seasons as Loyola Marymount's pitching coach, and each year the Lions won the WCC title and went to the NCAA regionals. In the summer of 2000, Kelly worked with the Team USA pitching staff in its early preparation for international play. Kelly joined Orleans as the pitching coach in 2001. In 2002, Coach K's staff had a 2.11 ERA (the best ever by Cardinals pitchers) and in 2004 it led the CCBL with a 2.37. His 2003 championship pitching staff was lights out, with a 2.36 ERA and a league-leading 397 Ks in 401 IP. All told, Kelly's pitching staffs have led the CCBL in ERA an astounding 7 times.


Spirit Award with Coach Steve DeBlasi in 2004, Kelly became the field manager in 2005, and was the unanimous choice of his fellow managers for the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year Award after leading the Cardinals to a record-setting 30-win season and the championship. Coach K was again named Manager of the Year in 2008 as his squad finished the regular season in first place overall (25-17-2). In 2015, Kelly led the Firebirds to a franchise record of 31-12-1 (.716) and again was named the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year. . In 2017, his Birds captured the President's Trophy once more, and he received his fourth Mike Curran Award. Under his leadership, Orleans is a perennial playoff contender. Coach K's overall regular season winning percentage of .577 leads all active CCBL Managers.

It's no surprise to anyone who knows him that Kelly enjoys the respect, affection and admiration of his players, fellow coaches and colleagues here and around the league and in the wider baseball community; he's a favorite around town, having made countless friends over the years. Orleans fans know they'll see a first class team on the field every summer with Kelly at the helm.

Kelly established his "ABC" or Academy of Baseball and Character, where young players "learn to play the game the right way." We can attest to that. Orleans welcomes a true gentleman and a terrific leader back for his eighteenth summer. Kelly is engaged to Donna Barney and resides in Playa del Rey, CA. O

He was a unanimous selection to the Big East First Team, and the New Jersey Collegiate Baseball Association's (NJCBA) Player of the Year. He set the Seton Hall career record for doubles (56) and tied the single-season Pirate record for doubles with 24, also a conference best. His team-high batting average of .365 was third in the Big East. Batting primarily in the cleanup position in the lineup, Papaccio led the Pirates in seven offensive categories, including batting average, slugging percentage (.554) and RBIs (53).

Named to the Louisville Slugger NCAA Division I All-American Third Team by Collegiate Baseball, he was drafted in the 18th round by the Chicago Cubs in the 2013 draft, and played for two years in the Cubs organization, reaching the Double-A level. Papaccio played an additional year of independent baseball before entering the coaching field. In 2016, he joined the staff of Manhattan College as volunteer assistant coach, and then returned to his alma mater as a volunteer assistant coach. Papaccio will work with the infielders and hitters for the Birds. Welcome to Orleans, Coach! O

EARL (WHITEY) FIELDS DUNHAM | FEBRUARY 23, 1927 - MARCH 11, 2018

Born in Worcester, Whitey graduated from Orleans High School and served his nation in the U.S. Army during World War II. Following his discharge, he returned to Orleans and married his high school sweetheart, Betty, in 1947. Whitey had a 40+ year career with the Engineering Department of the Massachusetts DPW. Upon retirement, he became an attendant at both Nauset and Skaket Beach for many summers.

Whitey leaves a long legacy of devotion and contributions to youth sports in the community. He played for the forerunner of the Firebirds, the Orleans A.C. (town team), in the late 40s and early 50s, and then became a key founder of Little League Baseball in Orleans; the Little League field next to the Town Hall was named in his honor. Whitey is remembered by generations of local high school athletes as a referee for soccer and baseball, and a baseball umpire. COACH'S CORNER

HOW THE FIREBIRDS ROSTER IS DETERMINED

After seventeen summers in Orleans, this is the question people ask me the most. There is no short, easy answer. Some people think the league holds a draft. Others believe the Firebirds' "front office" puts our team together. Neither of these is true. The fact is, the roster selection is entirely our coaching staff's and my responsibility, with input from many. While it is a lot of fun, assembling the roster is, without question, a manager's biggest challenge.

To steal a line from our legendary 1980 USA Olympic hockey coach, Herb Brooks, we are looking for the "right" guys to play in Orleans. We want elite talent, but more importantly, we are looking for young men who have great character and who will represent themselves, their universities, their families, Orleans, and the Cape Cod Baseball league in an exemplary manner. There are over 300 Division 1 schools alone; add D2, D3, and junior college players, and there are a lot of players from which to choose.

So, how does it all get started? The initial contact I have with a player is most likely with a prospective player's college coach calling me. They want to get their players in the right developmental environment during the summer. So conversations are held about our needs, and how their players might fit our needs. Those conversations, along with information we receive on players from scouts, agents, and summer league coaches from around the country, help us develop a solid list from which to choose. Prospective players will even contact me themselves. With all of this information, we assemble a roster that will normally consist of fifteen pitchers and fifteen position players. This being summer eighteen

in Orleans, I have developed

some solid relationships with

different programs and people

over the years. For instance,

Jason Gill, the Head Coach at

Loyola Marymount University,

was a big reason that I wound up in Orleans, so I will always try to make room for his players. He is a tremendous coach and a great friend, and I had the honor and privilege of coaching with "Gilly" at LMU in 1999 and 2000. I also had the honor and privilege of having Robert Woodard, the pitching coach at North Carolina, and Mike Clement, a current assistant at Ole Miss, on our coaching staffs in Orleans, so our roster will normally have Tar Heels and/or Rebels on it. We will also have at least a couple of "Vandy Boys" on our roster, as well. This summer we have four, the maximum you can have from one college program. I met Tim Corbin, Vanderbilt's Head Coach, when he was an assistant with the USA Team back in 2000, and we have remained close friends ever since. I also have a long-standing relationship with Duke, dating back to 2007, when Nate Freiman became the first Blue Devil to play for us. Carmen Carcone, the former Orleans manager who preceded me, who now scouts internationally for the Florida Marlins, is extremely helpful with roster input. And I would be completely remiss if I didn't mention Alex Levitt, the current Director of Player Development at Vanderbilt. Alex also worked for the 'Birds a few summers back, and we fondly call him our "Orleans Scouting Director." I can't even begin to tell you how


many hours he and I have spent on the phone discussing players. Even Miss Donna, my fiancée and USC alum, will get her two cents in with roster choices. She loves it when we have a Trojan in Orleans.

Work on the roster is never complete. It is a year-round process with names of potential players arriving via phone calls, texts, and emails constantly. Our team for this summer was pretty much set by the end of last summer, as is normally the case. We are allowed a 30-man roster, and after those players have been selected, there are still challenges. Invites to the USA Team go out, players get injured, pitchers get shut down, and teams advance to the Super-Regionals and the College World Series in Omaha. All of this does not transpire until late May or early June, so this time period can be pretty hectic. We acquire "temporary" players to fill the spots of our "contracted" players that will not arrive in time for the start of the season. It has the feeling of doing a big Sudoku puzzle daily until all the "numbers" fit in the right spaces. It also gives me a feeling of what it must be like to be a Major League Baseball general manager and the challenges that are faced on a daily basis.

As I write this in April, we are already looking at potential 'Birds for the summer of 2019. Texts, emails, and phone calls are continuous. Player evaluation is ongoing, and the team is being put together. So, if you know a quality young man that is also an elite collegiate player, shoot me an email at knicholson@loyolahs.edu. 





A VISIT WITH FORMER MAJOR LEAGUER AND ORLEANS PLAYER NATE FREIMAN. TALKING ABOUT HIS LIFE IN AND AFTER BASEBALL

ate Freiman played for the Orleans Carbefore enjoying a nine-year professional career, including two seasons with the Oakland A's. Nate retired from the game in May and recently spoke with us about his career in baseball.

Baseball is a game of failure, and many very good college players struggle while on the Cape. How did you deal with the tough

I played two years in Orleans, and I definitely struggled at times. It's how you respond to it. You'll have a couple days where you don't get any hits, strike out a lot. The pitching is really elite up

there. I played with some really good players who had some pretty rough summers.

A prime example is Brandon Crawford with the San Francisco Giants (3-time Gold Glove winner, 2-time World Champion). You look up his Cape League numbers with us in Orleans (.189 batting average, 45 strikeouts in '07) and he didn't have the best summer statistically. Yet, he focused on being a good team guy, played great defense, picked up the guys around him. He handled adversity really well.

Unfortunately, I saw some other guys who internalized that failure, withdrew from teammates, let it affect them. It was sad to see.

In 2007 with the Birds you won the CCBL Manny Robello 10th Man Award for dedication on and off the field. What did that award mean to you?

That was a really special honor to win the Manny Robello Award. When it's all said and done, people won't really remember the kind of player you were. Hopefully what they take away is he's a good guy, that you didn't know if he had a good game or a bad game based on now he treated you. That's the type of teammate I wanted to be. Basically, you want to be the kind of guy people are happy for when you have success.

The type of guy who puts others ahead of themselves. That's the type of guy I've tried to be.

You played for the Oakland A's for two years (2013-14). Was there a special memory from that time?

We went to the playoffs both years. In '13 we won the division. In '14 we went to the Wild Card game, in which I played.

As a team, getting to pop bottles of champagne is really fun. There's nothing better than celebrating with teammates, and I still have one of those bottles.

As an individual, I actually hit a walk-off single against Mariano Rivera in 2013. It was an 18-inning game in Oakland and I didn't enter until the 13th inning, and I got two at-bats.

So in the 18th, with two guys on, they walked Jed Lowrie to load the bases and to get to me. I remember looking around and wondering, "wait a minute, this is Mariano Rivera." I grew up in Boston, he's this sort of quasi-mythical figure.

So I was thinking "here comes that cutter." I dove toward the outside, but he threw me a twoseamer that almost hit me in the hands. He threw me another one that sawed my bat in half, but somehow I dumped the ball into left field for the game-winner.

In Major League Baseball you saw many guys with elite stuff. Was there one pitcher that really wowed

(Chris) Sale (now of the Boston Red Sox). I had a couple starts against him. Generally speaking as a hitter, with fewer than two strikes. you're looking for a pitch in a zone that you can drive. You're looking to do damage. If it's a strike but a pitch you don't really like, you lay off and look for something better.

With Sale, no matter what count I was in, I felt like it was going to be a struggle to just hit the ball.

We were in Chicago, I was batting behind Josh Donaldson. Sale, by his standards, wasn't having his best day, and Donaldson had just homered. He was clearly ticked, and here I come to the plate. The first pitch he threw me was a 95mph fastball, right on the inside corner, something I couldn't do anything with. Then he threw me a curve ball. Now, he steps toward the first base dugout, and the curve out of his hand looks like it's going to the backstop, but it curved right back over the plate. Then he threw a 97-mph fastball that I whiffed on.

I remember walking back to the dugout and asking myself "which one of those pitches was I supposed to hit?"

You were one of the tallest position players in the game at 6-8. The challenges for such a tall hitter are obvious (i.e. covering large strike zone). Are there any advantages to being that tall?

One is having real leverage. I could get out front of balls, through off-speed pitches, barrel them up and pull them, keeping them in play.

By the end of my career, pitchers were really trying to jam me inside. I adjusted and started standing pretty far away from the plate, stepping inward.

I had a lot more success against lefties. Sometimes with the ball coming across, because it starts from the other side, even if they're pitching in, it's a little easier to get to, rather than a righty throwing that two-seamer that starts in and moves even further in.

You played for Team Israel in the 2017 World Baseball Classic. Some dubbed the team the "Jamaican Bobsled Team of Baseball" and painted your team as real underdogs, but you had quite a bit of success. What do your remember from that tournament?

The real surprise win for us was beating South Korea, a team that had gone really far in previous tournaments, by one run in ten innings. We talked about shocking the world, which might have been a little hyperbole, but

we at least shocked ourselves.

We also beat Cuba, but they didn't have some of their stars like Aldonis Chapman or Yoenis Cespedes. Now they were good, don't get me wrong, but the real outstanding teams were Japan and The Netherlands.

The Netherlands had a lineup loaded with stars - Jurickson Profar, Didi Gregorius, Xander Bogaerts, Wladimir Balentien. Playing against those guys and beating them was truly an amazing experience.

You faced Japan in the Tokyo Dome. Can you describe that environment?

It was crazy. The Tokyo Dome is such an iconic venue, right in the middle of the city. The game started at 7pm, yet we walk on to the field at 5pm to stretch, and there were already 30,000 people backs, he'd put our guys in the best position to succeed.

You played at Duke (2006-09), a program now bursting on the national scene. What's it like seeing your alma mater enjoying this kind of success?

What Coach (Chris) Pollard has done has been really fun to follow. It was cool to see many Duke players do so well in The Cape last year, especially in the All-Star Game (Duke's Griffin Conine of Cotuit and Firebird Jimmy Herron were named co-MVPs). They have some serious talent now.

Your wife Amanda (Blumenherst) was an elite golfer, winning the National Women's Player-of-the-Year at Duke three times. She also won the 2008 US Women's Amateur while you were playing in Orleans. Tell us about that experience.

What are you guys doing now and what might the future hold?

more difficult.

I've travelled so much and been away from everybody the last few years, so right now I'm spending time with the kids, Amanda and with family and friends.

I'm working with one of my former teammates in creating a baseball talk show on this start up app, called FanCred. I'm also excited to go back to school, it's a really special place for us.

As far as after school (Nate is pursuing an MBA at Duke), baseball is something I'm really passionate about. Working in a front office is a natural path, but there are many other areas to pursue in the game of baseball. We'll see what opportunities present themselves toward the end of my studies.

Amanda is doing work for the Golf Channel, hosting a new show called "Shotmakers," sort of like the "Big Break," which takes place at TopGolf Las Vegas. She'll also do commentary on Golf Central & Morning Drive for some of the biggest women's events throughout the summer.

She knows so much about golf, and since I know so little about the game, I'm actually only now understanding her level of expertise. It's like living with somebody

feel. Seeing the lawn chairs set up early on the terraced Hill and then filled with so many fans at night. I remember how cool it was to interact with fans of all ages after the game, on the field.

In retrospect, it was really like something out of a movie.

What about off the field, in the community?

I stayed with an awesome host family, the Garran's (Firebird Executive Committee member Steve, Rhonda, Nate, Allison, Meghan), who are known everywhere around that area. They were fantastic to me, and I still keep in touch with them.

I worked out quite a bit at the local gym there. We'd go to Nauset Beach and enjoy the ocean. And I'll never forget the little restaurants, eating great fish & chips, and occasionally, great lobster.

That's one of the fun things about the Cape. It's not a city feel, especially as you get farther east, it gets more and more relaxed, sort of like you're on vacation. Yet that was juxtaposed with playing against the top competition in the country, and the stress and struggles which are part of the game.

It's an experience I'll never

in the stands. I couldn't believe how engaged they were.

He's all about preparation. He goes into these games knowing more about the other team than anyone. He'll go through every piece of information that is available. We really felt he had our

My dad had this flash drive thing plugged into his computer that enabled mobile internet, so he was in the stands watching her match. I'm playing 1st base with one eye on him to see if he's smiling. Have you and Amanda ever debated what's more difficult, hitting a stationary golf ball or a baseball coming at 90 mph?

I'll say this. What golfers do that is so difficult is hit the ball with such precision. And there are no teammates to pick you up,







HISTORIAN'S CORNER





The 1954 Orleans Sparklers

As we watch our beloved Firebirds play under the lights at Eldredge Park, is hard to imagine that organized baseball on the Cape wasn't always this way. Today we watch potential major leaguers playing on a major league quality field in a very professional setting. This setting didn't just happen; it evolved due to the hard work of dedicated volunteers and a supportive community.

Prior to 1963, the league was a Town League, where local players competed on town teams. It was a very hardscrabble environment where teams

competed for town pride. The following account provides a great picture of what organized baseball was like circa 1920. It is written by local historian Sam Sherman, who has a wonderful website called Sam's Scrapbook.

My father played baseball for the Orleans Town Team with the likes of the Smith boys, Eidie Nickerson, Elmer Darling, and Claude Hopkins, among others, (circa 1920 or before). The Orleans team would board the morning train for P'town, play the game, and ride the late afternoon train back home to Orleans. Seems like a smooth itinerary, eh?

More often than not, however, something would happen and already frayed nerves from previous experiences would lead into a fight, and the Orleans players would have to beat a hasty retreat back down the railroad tracks, which, fortunately, passed right by the ball field, keeping just ahead of irate P'town players and townsfolks as they hurled judgmental remarks along with bone-threatening sticks and stones.

This was hard-nosed, serious baseball to be sure. It is said that tensions between the two teams got so tense that the Selectmen from the two towns met to see what they could do to patch up relations, and all agreed that each team would do their best to overcome their differences.

Fast forward to 1954. The Cape League was still a local league, with teams from various towns having come and gone over the years. The Orleans team was now called the Sparklers, and consisted of local guys who just loved the game. The Sparklers became the bi-state (Massachusetts and Vermont) and were invited to go to Wichita Kansas to play in the National Baseball Congress Tournament.

While the Sparklers finished seventh in the tournament, it was a great day for Orleans. A town of less than 2000 people at the time sent its team to play the best in the nation in this national contest of amateur and semi-pro leagues. 1954 was the twentieth year that the tournament was played. Many of the town residents saw the team off at Depot Square as they departed for Wichita. Board of Selectmen Chairman Arthur R. Finlay delivered a farewell speech, and the Orleans Band played at the ceremony. Some residents even motored out to Wichita to cheer the team on. O



OUR CLINIC PHILOSOPHY

The co-ed clinic is dedicated to teaching the fundamentals of baseball. Skills and technical instruction will cover throwing, catching, fielding, hitting and base running. All level of abilities are identified, and all instruction is based on the age, ability and playing experience of each boy and girl. 


